Our congregation is committed to preserving this church as a holy place of safety and protection for all who enter and as a place in which all people can experience the love of God through relationships with others.

I have agreed to work in this ministry of caregiving for children and/or youth in our congregation. As a participant in this ministry, I agree to:

- 1. Demonstrate behavior appropriate for a person who has responsibility for children. To that end, I will:
 - Maintain a calm, loving, and gentle demeanor,
 - Model appropriate behavior for children,
 - Demonstrate respect for children, parents, my supervising teacher(s), and co-workers at all times, and
 - Focus my attention and interaction on the children, not on other workers except as may be required to comply with the Abuse Prevention Policy.
- 2. Seek to understand the children in my care. This means that I will learn about the physical characteristics, developmental characteristics, and appropriate ways of responding and interacting with children of various temperaments and personality styles (resources available upon request).
- 3. Participate in training/orientation sessions offered by my church leaders as required and to familiarize myself with the Abuse Prevention Policy and Procedures.
- 4. Abide by the policies and procedures established by JWUMC and the Baltimore Washington Conference for this ministry, including the Abuse Prevention Policy and Procedures.
